Doing nothing is not an option Last year 5,000 people successfully marched to save Whittington Hospital services. 1,000 local youth are campaigning to save youth centres. Students, backed by trades unions, have held many demonstrations to defend education. Many others have started to object and protest about proposed cuts affecting their services and jobs. The Haringey Alliance for Public Services have held local rallies and marches, and handed out over 70,000 leaflets to alert local people. Alliances and campaigns are springing into action all over the UK and the Government has been shaken.



What can we do together? Together we can reverse the cuts programme if we take action and say NO. We call on all Haringey's residents, community groups, workers, and trades unions to link together and stand up for what's right. Councillors must resist privatisation, oppose all cuts and refuse to implement them – or stand down.
